Our History


The Newark Valley Historical Society has been an important part of our community since 1976. The following year Mrs. Myrtie Louise Billings Hills put her family home in our care. This generous act has inspired dozens of volunteers to share their time and talents in first restoring the Farmstead, and later sharing its history with the public. Several outbuildings have been added near Asa Bement's historic farmhouse. Rollie Noble reconstructed the blacksmith shop. An exciting barn raising in 2000 brought the Herrick Barn (an English Threshing Barn from Weltonville) to its present site. Another labor of love was the Welcome Center.

The Sycamore Bridge which crosses the Owego Creek provides access to the Sycamore Nature Trails.

The Newark Valley Depot has also been restored by Historical Society volunteers. It's a grand place for the free concerts and lectures that fill the Friday nights of summer.





- ◆ Martha Walter portrays **Apple Annie**, a chatty villager.












